Mrs. Ruth Holms was honored for her fifteen years in the Pierre school system. Mrs. Holms established Riggs chapter of the Future Nurses of America. She is well known and liked for her friendly dispensation of aspirins and advice.

A graduate of Augustana, Mr. Palmer Fjelstad, was a well-known half-miler before he began teaching. He has served the Pierre schools for fifteen years as shop teacher and, previously, as a coach.

A man of many hobbies --among them being photography, hunting, gardening, flying, operating "ham" radios--Mr. Norris Paulsen has served Pierre schools for sixteen years as biology teacher and administrator. He is the business manager for the entire school system presently.

Since 1945 Mr. Baird Crance has missed only four and one-half days. He has taught for eighteen years in Pierre. He is a member of the honorary math-science fraternity, Sigma Delta Epsilon. Mr. Crance's hobbies are photography and riflery. He began the Lewis and Clark Rifle Club.

Mr. Walter Flannery has served the Pierre schools for seven-teen years. Another half-miler (at Yankton College), Mr. Flannery did graduate work at S.D. State College and U.S.D. He received his Masters degree after a year-long institute for Guidance at the University of N. Dak. National Honor Society elected him "Teacher of the Year" in 1960.

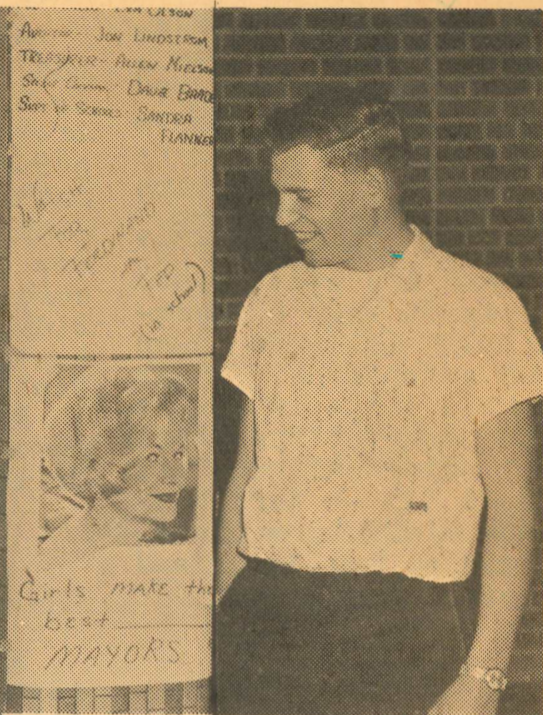
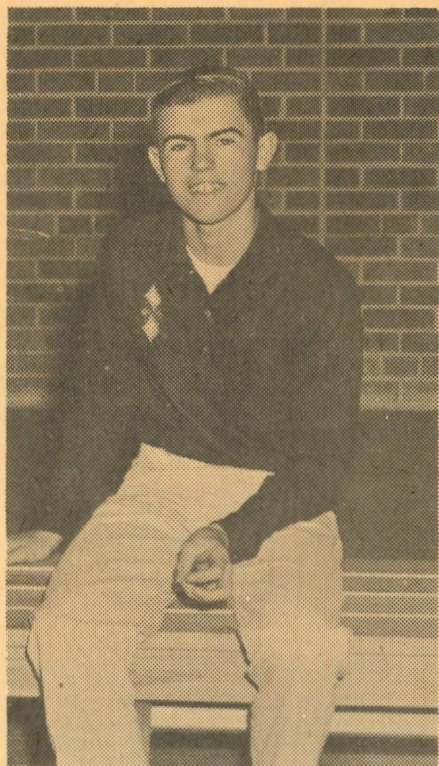

Her future plans are to go to college at the University of Denver, and major in marketing and fashion buying.

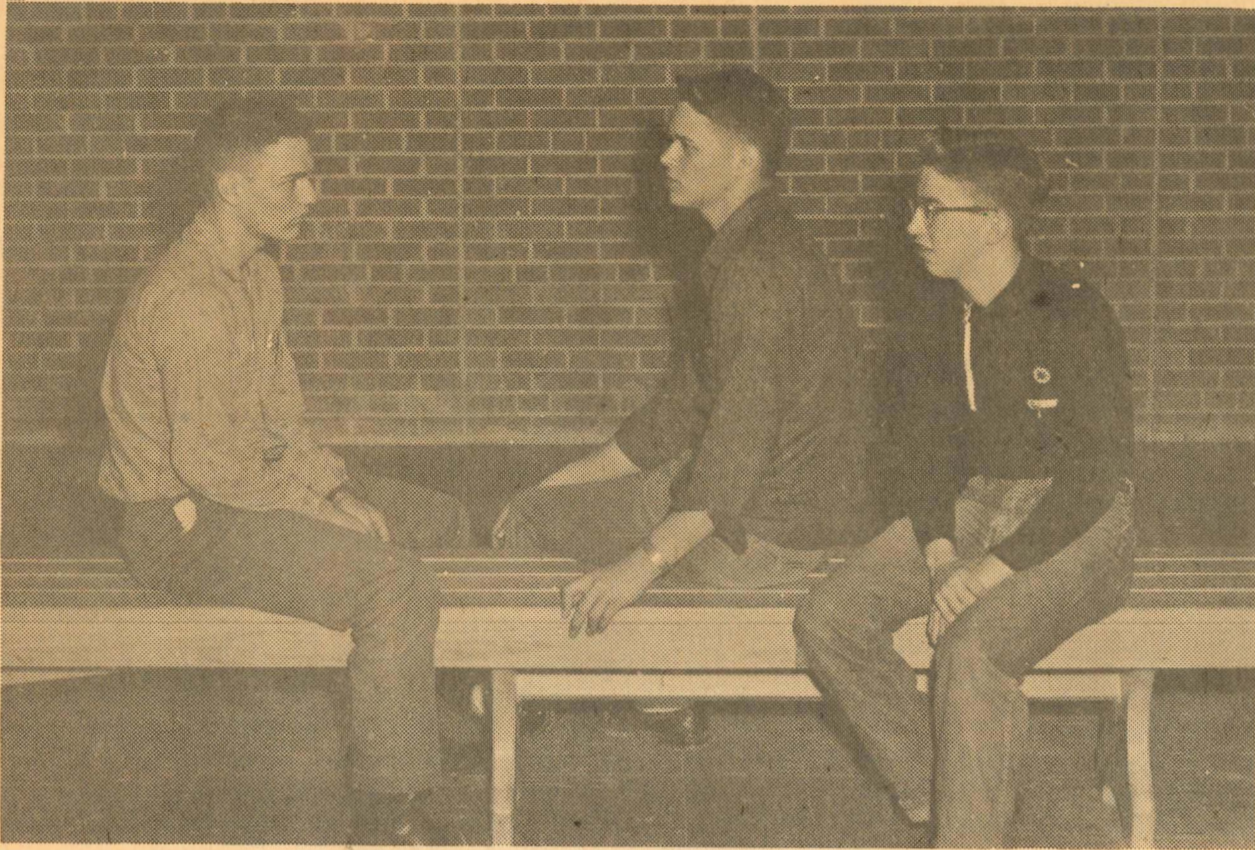
Diana thinks the Senior year is the best of all.
