Rounding the corner for home I think to myself, "Another day, another dollar. Such is the life of a senior."

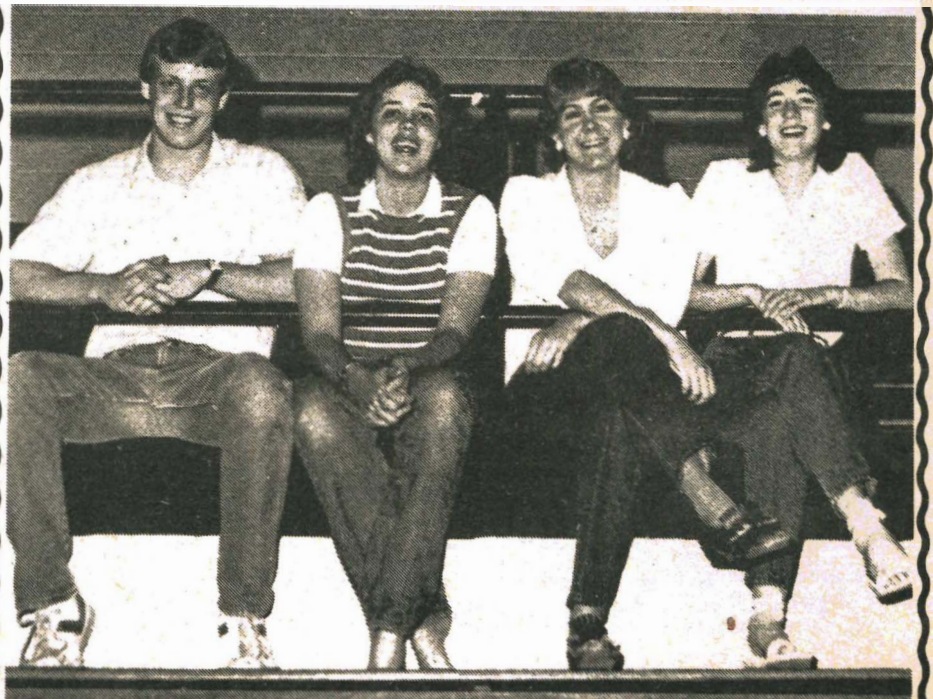

True seniors say it with class.

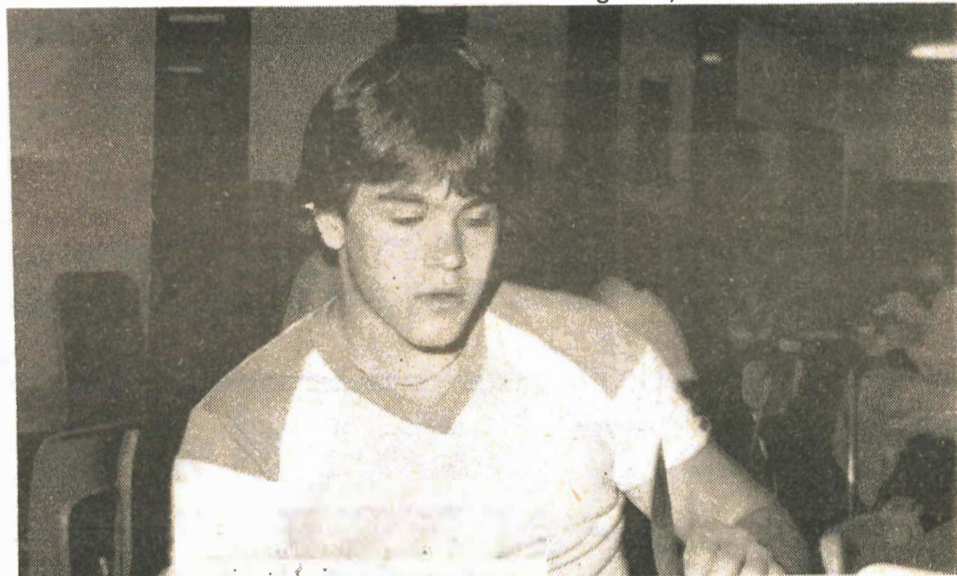
P.S. Some jokes are subtle. If something seems dumb it is probably just over your head. Save yourself some embarrassment and laugh anyway.

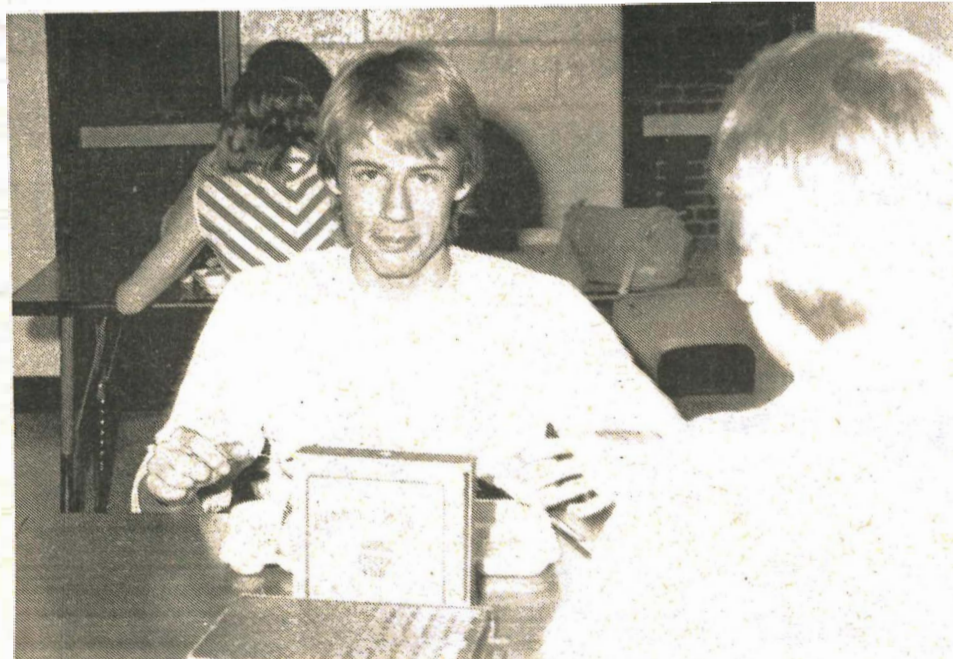

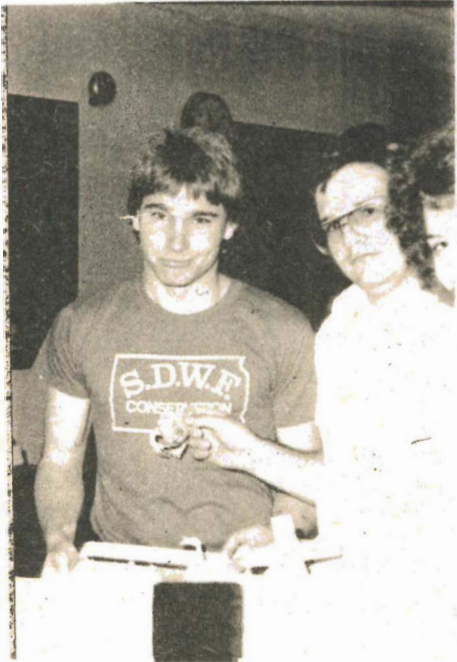
