Attendance Announced

Superintendent Thom sen wrote the following summary of the attend ance for the first twothirds of the year:

The attendance records of the students in Junior and Senior High school for the fourth six-vecks has improved considerably over the corresponding period a year ago, an increase from 94.90 to 95.90 per

the Junior Class has the highest percentage of attendance in the six grades 7 through 12. They have a percentag of 96.53 attendance, and are closely followed by the 7th graders with with 96.3, and the lowest group is the benior with 95.05 percent.

The three grades in the Junior High outrank the total attendance record of the Senior High 95.06 to 95.70 for the fourth six - week period, the Junior Class leads all classes with a percentage of 97.17. Vith a little extra effort on the part of the Juniors they could end the year with the best attendance re ord. At present theware closely by the oth followed graders.

The total attendance record for the year up b the end of the fourth six-reeks period shows the Junior High leading the Senior High 96.69to 96.26 percent.




