Students have a blast in Chem II

This year, for the first time in six years, ten Riggs students had an opportunity to take Chemistry II. The students taking advantage of this 'experience of a lifetime,' include Jason Cool, David Farries, Dan Hill, Jason Kaul (Mr. I-didn't-do-it), Lorne Lawrence (Mr. Burning Splint), Steve Maxwell, Steve Rasmussen, Paul Robbennolt, Mark Schneider (Mr. Magnesium), and Brian Weiss (Mr. Poisonous Gases).

Chemistry II was taught this year by Mr. Bill Petersen. The class takes off from where Chemistry I left off. It involves a closer study of the elements and their compounds. Also, in Chemistry II there is a greater emphasis placed on hands-on experiences.

In other words, there are a lot more labs being done. To the students, this is what makes Chemistry II so appealing. Mr. Petersen usually tries to spoil the fun by requiring write-ups, but the students survived those too.

Throughout the year, students have worked with such things as poisonous gases and radioactive rocks. They have also learned how to make both nuclear and nitro-glycerine bombs although nobody has proven that they actually made one yet.


